Flagler County Celebrates 90 Years!

Ninety years to the day after celebrating its inception, Flagler County's 90th birthday was celebrated on July 2, 2007 by the Flagler Beach Historical Museum as part of a Fundraiser Lunch at the Outback Steakhouse in Palm Coast.

Seventy-five supporters, including city and county government representatives, attended the event which featured **Diane Marquis**, past president of the Flagler County Historical Society, as keynote speaker. Diane shared the history leading up to the recognition of Flagler County on July 1, 1917. Her anecdotes included stories about **Isaac, George, and Robert Moody**, each of whom was instrumental in the development and growth of Flagler County.

Special guests included many "Local Legends" -- people who were either living in 1917 or who descended from Flagler County founders. Joining in the celebration were granddaughters of each of the three Moody brothers.






## MEET YOUR FELLOW MEMBERS!

In Honor of 2007 Gala's Summer of Love: Celebrate 40 Years Ago Today!



**LETTERS TO THE EDITOR**

Dear Editor:

For seven or eight years we have been spending the winters in Flagler Beach, and decided we would include the city in a two week's tour we're enjoying around the country.

We're happy to see great improvements around Flagler Beach. My wife and I enjoyed the new Thriftway store last year, and now the beautiful new Jiffy Store replaces the old dilapidated buildings on Route 100 and is so brightly lighted at nights and convenient for early and late shoppers. The old shackled house removed from next to the City Hall and Bamboo Bar really makes a noticeable difference improving the general "cleaned-up" appearance. There is an addition to the City Pier Building under construction which we hear is to expand the tackle shop, and create a porch or lounging area for the visitors.


We always enjoy sitting out-side watching the ocean and walking up and down the beach late afternoons after dinner, and now the new provisions for visitors to enjoy a lounge is a good thing for the Beach.

1967 newspapers weren't all that different from today with advertising making the biggest splash. But some things have changed a lot! Check out these headlines from October 12th, 1967. New coast to coast Interstate driving was on its way. Visitors already here had many observations and shared them in Letters to the Editor. Fashion featured "schoolottes" and other teen faves. Color TV was a new phenomenon.

You could feed the whole neighborhood with rib steaks at just 89 cents/lb. 29 cent a lb. fryers and 10 lbs. of potatoes for 49 cents. Plenty of cash left for a dessert: 20 oz of strawberries for 49 cents, pound cake for 69 cents topped with preserves: 18 oz jars, 3 kinds for just \$1.00. And at the height of their popularity were the Bunnell High School cheerleaders and "The Biggest Little Band in Dixie!" majorettes.
